RULES, INFORMATION, AND GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

The 2022 Cullom Junior Fair will commence Wednesday, August 10, 2022 and continue through Saturday, August 13th. There will be no general admission charge.

Pre-registration is required for all departments. DEADLINE: All **mailed entries** must be **postmarked by Monday, August 1st**. **On-Line entries** close at **Midnight Sunday, August 7, 2022**. Visit our website cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links. Those making on-line entries are asked to mail entry fees to the address below, or bring to the fair. Entries received after the deadline will be accepted with the following late fees:

Livestock Late Fees: \$10.00 per exhibitor.

Domestic Arts/Floriculture Late Fees: \$1.00 per entry.

1. Preregistration is not required for showmanship or champions.
2. No refunds will be made on entries. No additional entries will be allowed on show day.
3. Production Livestock Exhibitors: Please enter AND pay entry fees for Grooming and Presentation and Average Daily Gain only once.
4. NSF checks subject to \$25 fee. Premiums will be held until paid.
5. The fair reserves the right to limit the use of fans and the area in which generators may be used.
6. Health papers WILL be checked. See requirements. Note: Ear notching crossbred swine does not meet ID requirements - tags required.
7. Registration papers will be required for all animals showing in purebred classes.
8. After entries are made, they will not be changed unless an error has been made by fair staff.
9. The fair reserves the right to reject any entry not satisfactory to them.
10. All exhibitors must show their own entries, unless multiple animals in same class.
- 11. New This Year: All Exhibitors must be between the ages of 6 and 20, inclusive.**
12. All livestock entries must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor for a period of at least 90 days prior to the opening of this fair.
13. In no case will there be a refund of entry fees to non-winners.
14. Pens and stalls will be assigned.

LIABILITY

Every precaution will be taken to safeguard animals, articles, exhibitors and patrons, but the management of the Cullom Junior Fair will not be responsible for any loss by fire, theft, storm, or any accidents or injuries to people or livestock.

EXHIBITOR AGES

This shall be regarded exclusively as a junior fair, with the exception of the Floriculture and Domestic Art Departments which are considered open departments. Junior Exhibitor ages shall be **at least 6 years of age on show day**, and not to exceed 20 years of age on show day.

SHOWMANSHIP ELIGIBILITY

Any exhibitor having once one showmanship at the Cullom Junior Fair in a given department is no longer eligible for showmanship competition in that same department. However, winners of junior showmanship may become eligible for senior showmanship in that same department upon reaching the proper age. This is true with pee wee also. You may only show in one showmanship class per year. Pee Wee showmanship is for those too young to exhibit at the fair as an exhibitor and is for those under age 6. Novice is for any junior aged first year exhibitor. Junior division is ages 6-12; senior division is for ages 13 and older. No entry fee is required. Showmanship is open only to those exhibitors within each given specie, with the exception of Pee Wees. (You must show in the species show to show in showmanship).

HEALTH PAPERS

Health papers are to be enclosed in a white envelope which bears the exhibitor's name. This envelope and enclosed health papers are to be submitted in the office of the secretary immediately after unloading and penning livestock.

WEIGHT RULES

All weights of animals are final after animal leaves scale. Any request for a reweigh must be made by the exhibitor at the time the animal is weighed. Weight recorded by the fair officials will be final.

DISCLAIMER

The Illinois Department of Agriculture shall use its best efforts to secure sufficient appropriations to fund premiums. In any year for which the General Assembly of the State of Illinois fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such premiums, premium amounts may not be accurately reflected in the premium listing.

AWARDS

The decision of the judges shall be deemed final. Ribbons will be affixed at the time of the awards. Premium money will be awarded to exhibitors earning such by the fair treasurer.

PROTESTS

Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$25.00 with the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited to the Cullom Junior Fair Association if protest is not sustained. All protests must be made in writing, signed by the protestor and must be lodged within one half hour prior to official show starting time.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS

The fairgrounds will be open for exhibitors to bring livestock Thursday, August 11, 2022 4:00 pm. All animals are to be in place no later than Friday morning at 8 am. All exhibits will be released at 4:00 pm on Saturday of the fair. All animals must be shown in the judging ring by the owner unless excused by the department superintendent. All livestock must meet requirements governing their exhibition. Be sure to read department rules!

DEPARTMENT A - BEEF

Premiums Offered \$3285.00

Beef Superintendent - Jim Moritz (815) 674-2271 ; Asst Superintendent - Marlin Donley

Beef Department Rules:

1. All livestock exhibits must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor for a period of at least 90 days prior to the fair.
2. Entry fees are \$4.50 per class. Stall fees are \$2.00 per head. No refunds will be given.
3. Entry must be purebred and registered except in crossbred classes. Registration must be in the exhibitor's name. Registration papers will be checked by the superintendent on Friday.
4. All cattle exhibited must be accompanied by a certificate of health issued and endorsed by a qualified veterinarian. Be sure to read state of Illinois rules.
5. Heifer classes will be divided into 3 equal classes, by age as recorded on registration papers.
6. The fair board will mouth market animals for age. All market animals must have all their milk teeth unless deemed by the fair veterinarian to be traumatic tooth loss.
7. Steers will be placed according to weight into two classes. A third class in any given breed will be established if there are 12 or more steers in any given breed, including crossbreds.
8. No wood shavings will be allowed unless a mat is used underneath.
9. Steers and market heifers must weigh at least 1000 pounds to sell at the auction, and must weigh at least 900 pounds to be exhibited.
10. Cow and Calf class shall have all breeds and crossbred show together. Calf may be either sex.
11. Junior Bull Calf and Junior Heifer Calf must be no older than January 1, 2022. The Jr. Heifer Calf is not eligible to be shown in the age heifer classes.
12. **New this year:** There will be one market heifer class. Heifers entered are eligible to show for Grand Champion Market Animal but may not be shown in the breeding heifer show.
13. **Pre-registration is required.** All **mailed entries** must be **postmarked by Monday, August 1st.** **On-Line entries** close at **Midnight Sunday, August 7, 2022.** Visit our website cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links and fair updates.. Those making on-line entries are asked to mail entry fees or bring to the fair. Entries received after the deadline will be accepted with a late fee of \$10 per exhibitor. Dairy Department Rules:

1. Each exhibitor shall be limited to one entry in each class.
2. All livestock exhibits must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor for a period of at least 90 days prior to the fair.
3. Entry fees are \$4.50 per class. Stall fees are \$2.00 per head. No refunds will be given.
4. Entry shall be limited to purebred and registered in the exhibitor's name. Registration papers will be checked.
5. All cattle exhibited must be accompanied by a certificate of health issued and endorsed by a qualified veterinarian. Be sure to read state of Illinois rules.
6. No wood shavings will be allowed unless a mat is used underneath.
7. **Pre-registration is required. All mailed entries must be postmarked by Monday, August 1st. On-Line entries close at Midnight Sunday, August 7, 2022.** Visit our website cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links and fair updates.. Sheep Department Rules:

1. All livestock exhibits must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor for a period of at least 90 days prior to the fair.
2. Entry fees are \$2.50 per class. Stall fees are \$1.50 per head. No refunds will be given.
3. In all breeding classes, each exhibitor will be limited to one entry per class per breed. Each exhibitor is entitled to show two (2) market ewe lambs and two (2) market wethers; production animals shall not be counted toward the two. Classes will be determined by weight.
4. Ewe lambs or ram lambs entered in breeding classes must be purebred and registered in the exhibitor's name. **Registration papers will be checked!**
5. An exhibitor can only win Champion Production Pair two (2) consecutive years.
6. All lambs must be docked.
7. A breeding pen shall be 3 individuals; both sexes represented. One yearling may be used.
8. A market pair shall be 2 lambs either market ewe or market wether not shown as breeding stock.
9. Each animal may show in its own age class only.
10. Junior and Senior lambs are divided on January 1 birthdates.
11. Champion sheep (offered on the sale) shall remain for the sale.
12. Production sheep should enter classes 560 and 570. Enter ADG and Grooming only once.
13. Shepherd's Award presented to youth's overall performance throughout fair - given by superintendents
14. **Pre-registration is required. All mailed entries must be postmarked by Monday, August 1st.**
On-Line entries close at **Midnight Sunday, August 7, 2022.** Visit our website cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links and fair updates.. Those making on-line entries are asked to mail entry fees or bring to the fair. Entries received after the deadline will be accepted with a late fee of \$10 per exhibitor. No additional entries will be allowed on show day.

Sheep Costume Lead (Friday, 5:30 pm)

1. Open to anyone 14 years of age and younger.
2. Animals will be ewe lambs, yearling ewes, or wethers and must be trimmed and fitted for the show.
3. Entrants must wear a costume and lead their sheep on a halter.
4. Entry deadlines are the same as all other departments.
5. Entry fee \$5.50
6. Entry theme should promote the Sheep Industry
7. Costume Lead shall be scored using the following points:
 - Costume - 30 points
 - Promotion of Sheep Industry in Costume and Slogan - 20 points
 - How Sheep Handles - 20 points
 - How Child Handles and Leads Sheep - 30 points

DEPARTMENT G - SWINE

Premiums Offered \$2874.00

Swine Superintendent - Brian Haren; Asst. Superintendent - Gene Weber

1. All livestock exhibits must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor for a period of at least 90 days prior to the fair.
2. Entry fees are \$2.50 per class. Pen fees are \$1.50 per head. No refunds will be given.
3. The swine show is no longer a terminal show. There is no longer a limit to the number of pigs an exhibitor may show.
4. There will be no breeding classes. Market classes will be shown by weight.
5. No bedding is furnished.
6. All swine exhibited must be accompanied by a certificate of health issued and endorsed by a qualified veterinarian. Be sure to read state of Illinois rules. Ear notching crossbreds does not meet ID requirements - tags required.
7. All swine must be on the grounds and ready to weigh by 6:00 pm on Thursday, August 11, 2022
8. No oil is to be used on swine.
9. Exhibitors with pigs of identical weight will show in the same class.
10. Swine must weigh at least 220 pounds to sell on the auction. Must weigh 180 to show.
11. Barrows will be split into 12 classes. If there are more than 99 barrows entered, Class 13 will be offered and Class 14 will be offered if more than 106 barrows entered.
12. Gilts will be split into 8 classes. If there are more than 69 gilts entered, Class 28 will be offered and Class 29 will be offered if more than 76 gilts are entered.
13. **Pre-registration is required. All mailed entries must be postmarked by Monday, August 1st. On-Line entries close at Midnight Sunday, August 7, 2022.** Visit our website cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links and fair updates.. Those making on-line entries are asked to mail entry fees or bring to the fair. Entries received after the deadline will be accepted with a late fee of \$10 per exhibitor. DEPARTMENT I - RABBITS

1. All rabbit exhibits must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor.
2. Entry fees are \$1.00 per class. Late fee is \$10.00 per exhibitor.
3. All rabbits, except My Favorite Rabbit, must be tattooed.
4. Rabbits must be in place by 4:30 pm on Wednesday, August 10, 2022. The show will start promptly at 5:00 pm.
5. Rabbits are released at the conclusion of the rabbit show.
6. All exhibitors must bring entries to the judging table.
7. No limit on the number of rabbits entered, but only 2 premiums will be paid per class per exhibitor.
8. Purebred rabbits must have papers.
9. My Favorite Rabbit winner also receives a trophy. This class for any type of rabbit, especially pet rabbits. Entry judged on care provided for the rabbit, rabbit response to exhibitor, and exhibitor response to rabbit.
10. **Pre-registration is required.** All **mailed entries** must be **postmarked by Monday, August 1st.** **On-Line entries** close at **Midnight Sunday, August 7, 2022.** Visit our website cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links and fair updates.. Those making on-line entries are asked to mail entry fees or bring to the fair. Entries received after the deadline will be accepted with a late fee of \$10 per exhibitor. DEPARTMENT L - FLORICULTURE

11. Classes in floriculture department are open to ANYONE. It is not to be considered a junior department. However, youth are eligible and encouraged to show.
12. Entry fees of \$1.00 per class must be paid for each entry. Late entry fee is an additional \$1.00 per entry. No refunds will be given. No additional entries on show day.
13. Premiums will be paid after 3:00 pm on Saturday, August 13, 2022.
14. Entries must be checked in between 8:30 am and 11:00 am Friday, August 12, 2022 at the Cullom Community Building, and must remain in place until 3:00 pm Saturday, August 13, 2022. All exhibits MUST be removed by 4:00 pm. The fair is not responsible for items left after 4pm.
15. Each exhibitor will be limited to one entry per class. Exhibitors may enter as many classes as they wish. Each premium number is a different class.
16. Flowers must be **home grown** and **arranged** by the exhibitor.
17. Superintendents have the right to remove any insect infected or diseased plant from the judging area.
18. A "Best of Class" Rosette will be awarded in each section.
19. **Pre-registration is required.** All **mailed entries** must be **postmarked by Monday, August 1st.** **On-Line entries** close at **Midnight Sunday, August 7, 2022.** Visit our website cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links and fair updates.. Those making on-line entries are asked to mail entry fees or bring to the fair. Entries received after the deadline will be accepted with a late fee of \$1.00 per class. Category 1 - House Plants

All plants in dirt are considered potted/house plants. Container not judged.

Category 2 - Specimens

Each entry must have only 1 large or 3 small blooms or spikes with attached leaf or leaves in a small bottle or vase. Small flowers such as miniature marigold, petunia, etc. may be in a small container with oasis. Container not judged.

Category 3 - Arrangements

The quality of the flowers, artistic arrangement, and suitability of container will be considered in judging.

Category 4 - Garden Produce

Made with one or more garden produce.

Flower Show Tips

Be sure to wash your specimen to remove mud or dirt splatters.

Brush off grass clippings.

Clean off water spots.

Take off any parts of the specimen that are dry and browned or insect damaged.

Remove any leaves that are below the water level of the container in which it is shown.

Where three specimens are required for a class, choose specimens that are as nearly alike in size, color, and shape as possible.

Correct identification of your specimens is a must! If it is entered in the incorrect class you will be disqualified.

Save your tags when you buy your plant if it is a new variety.

Ask your local greenhouse or garden center for help if needed, or use the internet or public library.

DEPARTMENT M1 - JUNIOR DOMESTIC ARTS

20. Any youth between the ages of 6 and 20 years of age, inclusive, are eligible to show in this department.
21. **Each exhibitor will be limited to one entry per class.**
22. No article will be accepted if it has been entered in the Cullom Junior Fair in previous years.
23. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
24. Entry fees of \$1.00 per class must be paid for each entry. Late entry fee is an additional \$1.00 per entry. No refunds will be given. No additional entries on show day.
25. Premiums will be paid after 3:00 pm on Saturday, August 13, 2022.
26. Entries must be checked in between 8:30 am and 11:00 am Friday, August 12, 2022 at the Cullom Community Building, and must remain in place until 3:00 pm Saturday, August 13, 2022. All exhibits MUST be removed by 4:00 pm. The fair is not responsible for items left after 4pm.
27. Collections must be displayed in an appropriate display container (maximum of 2). Containers may not exceed 18" x 22".
28. The superintendent has the right to refuse items.

Food: All foods will be on paper plates and placed in plastic food bags. Include recipe with all entries. No mixes!

Clothing: All clothing or sewing items are to be on hangers and in clear plastic bags (cleaner bags)

Needlework: Needlework should not exceed 3 pieces (they are counted as one entry). Display to show quality of work.

Crafts: Craft exhibits should not exceed 3 pieces.

Art: Exhibit should not exceed 3 pieces. Display should be suitably framed, if appropriate. Photography shall consist of one enlarged photo or a grouping of 3 photos. They should be mounted or framed.

Breads: Exhibit shall consist of ¼ loaf or 3 muffins. Two (2) muffins or ¼ loaf to be on plate, covered. 3rd muffin or a slice wrapped in plastic and on top of the exhibit for judging.

DEPARTMENT M2 - ADULT DOMESTIC ARTS

Premiums Offered \$655.00

Adult Domestic Arts Superintendent - Joan Haren (815) 689-2659

1. This department is open to those exhibitors 21 years of age or older.
2. **Each exhibitor will be limited to one entry per class.**
3. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
4. Entry fees of \$1.00 per class must be paid for each entry. Late entry fee is an additional \$1.00 per entry. No refunds will be given. No additional entries on show day.
5. Premiums will be paid after 3:00 pm on Saturday, August 13, 2022.
6. Entries must be checked in between 8:30 am and 11:00 am Friday, August 12, 2022 at the Cullom Community Building, and must remain in place until 3:00 pm Saturday, August 13, 2022. All exhibits MUST be removed by 4:00 pm. The fair is not responsible for items left after 4pm.

Food: All foods will be on paper plate or cardboard and covered with clear plastic wrap which can be removed for judging. Include recipe with all entries except decorated cakes.

Needlework: Needlework should not exceed 3 pieces (they are counted as one entry). Place on cardboard or box bottom, cover with clear plastic which can be removed for judging.

Crafts: Craft exhibits should not exceed 3 pieces. If delicate, place in 3 sided box covered with removable plastic cover.

Breads: Exhibit shall consist of ¼ loaf or 3 muffins. Two (2) muffins or ¼ loaf to be on plate, covered. 3rd muffin or a slice wrapped in plastic and on top of the exhibit for judging.

Cookies: 3 cookies; 2 on plate and 3rd wrapped in plastic and placed on top of exhibit for judging.

Candy: Exhibit shall consist of 3 pieces, 2 on plate and 3rd wrapped in plastic and placed on top of exhibit for judging.

Decorated Cake: Exhibit shall consist of an 8" styrofoam or plastic base cake decorated. Exhibit should be on cardboard base or plate and covered with clear plastic that can be removed for judging. (8" cake, square or round)
