RULES, INFORMATION, AND GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

The 2026 Cullom Junior Fair will commence Wednesday, August 5, 2026 and continue through Saturday, August 8th. There will be no general admission charge.

(New/Changed Information is highlighted in yellow)

Pre-registration is required for all departments. DEADLINE: All **mailed entries** must be **postmarked by Monday, July 20th**. **On-Line entries** close at **Midnight Sunday, July 26, 2026**. Visit our website www.cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links. Those making on-line entries are asked to mail entry fees to the address below, or bring to the fair. Entries received after the deadline will be accepted with the following late fees: Livestock Late Fees: \$10.00 per exhibitor. Domestic Arts/Floriculture Late Fees: \$1.00 per entry.

1. Preregistration is not required for showmanship or champions.
2. No refunds will be made on entries. No additional entries will be allowed on show day.
3. Production Livestock Exhibitors: Please enter AND pay entry fees for Grooming and Presentation and Average Daily Gain only once.
4. NSF checks subject to \$25 fee. Premiums will be held until paid.
5. The fair reserves the right to limit the use of fans and the area in which generators may be used.
6. Health papers WILL be checked. See requirements at [2026 Health Requirements](#)
7. Registration papers will be required for all animals showing in purebred classes.
8. After entries are made, they will not be changed unless an error has been made by fair staff.
9. The fair reserves the right to reject any entry not satisfactory to them.
10. All exhibitors must show their own entries, unless multiple animals in same class.
11. Exhibitor age shall be up to 20 years of age, as of show day. Any assistance provided to the exhibitor in the show ring shall be provided by an "exhibitor aged" individual.
12. In no case will there be a refund of entry fees to non-winners.
13. Pens and stalls will be assigned.

LIABILITY

Every precaution will be taken to safeguard animals, articles, exhibitors and patrons, but the management of the Cullom Junior Fair will not be responsible for any loss by fire, theft, storm, or any accidents or injuries to people or livestock.

EXHIBITOR AGES

This shall be regarded exclusively as a junior fair, with the exception of the Floriculture, Ag Products, and Domestic Art Departments which are considered open departments. Junior Exhibitor ages shall not exceed 20 years of age on show day. There is no minimum age for exhibitors.

DISCLAIMER

The Illinois Department of Agriculture shall use its best efforts to secure sufficient appropriations to fund premiums. In any year for which the General Assembly of the State of Illinois fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such premiums, premium amounts may not be accurately reflected in the premium listing.

AWARDS

The decision of the judges shall be deemed final. Ribbons will be affixed at the time of the awards. Premium money will be awarded to exhibitors earning such by the fair treasurer.

PROTESTS

Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$25.00 with the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited to the Cullom Junior Fair Association if protest is not sustained. All protests must be made in writing, signed by the protestor and must be lodged within one half hour prior to official show starting time.

SHOWMANSHIP

Any exhibitor having won showmanship at the Cullom Junior Fair in a given department is no longer eligible for showmanship competition in that division of the department (except Dairy Department). Winners of a showmanship division may compete in the next level of showmanship in that department the following year, regardless of age. You may only show in one showmanship class per department per year. No entry fee is required. Showmanship is only open to those exhibitors within each given species, with the exception of PeeWee. (ie. you must show in the species show to show in showmanship).

Beef Showmanship Divisions:

Jr Showmanship: ages 12 and under as of show day

Senior Showmanship: ages 13-20 as of show day

PeeWee Showmanship - 6 years old or younger and not an exhibitor in that department.

Swine and Sheep Showmanship Divisions:

Novice Showmanship: Junior Aged and first time exhibiting that specie at CJF

Jr Showmanship: ages 9 and under as of show day

Intermediate Showmanship: Ages 10-15 as of show day

Senior Showmanship: ages 16-20 as of show day

PeeWee Showmanship - 6 years old or younger and not an exhibitor in that department.

HEALTH PAPERS

Health papers are to be enclosed in an envelope which bears the exhibitor's name. This envelope and enclosed health papers are to be submitted in the office of the secretary immediately after unloading and penning livestock. **Even though health papers are created electronically beginning this year, THEY ARE TO BE PRINTED AND BROUGHT TO THE FAIR. PLEASE DO NOT ASK THE FAIR OFFICE TO PRINT!**

WEIGHT RULES

All weights of animals are final after animal leaves the scale. Any request for a reweigh must be made by the exhibitor at the time the animal is weighed. Weight recorded by the fair officials will be final.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS

The fairgrounds will be open for exhibitors to bring livestock Thursday, August 6, 2026 4:00 pm. All animals are to be in place no later than Friday morning at 8 am, with the exception of swine which must be on the grounds and ready to weigh by 6 pm. All exhibits will be released at 4:00 pm on Saturday of the fair. All animals must be shown in the judging ring by the owner unless excused by the department superintendent. All livestock must meet requirements governing their exhibition. Be sure to read the department rules!

Individual identification of cattle and swine shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

DEPARTMENT A - BEEF

Premiums Offered \$7323.00

Beef Department Rules:

1. All livestock exhibits must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor for a period of at least 90 days prior to the fair.
2. **Entry fees are \$7.00 per class. There are no pen/stall fees.** No refunds will be given.
3. Entry must be purebred and registered except in crossbred classes. Registration must be in the exhibitor's name. Registration papers will be checked by the superintendent on Friday.
4. All cattle exhibited must be accompanied by a certificate of health issued and endorsed by a qualified veterinarian. Be sure to read the State of Illinois rules. **STEERS MUST NOW HAVE HEALTH PAPERS.** Individual ID of each animal **MUST** be by USDA official animal ID number ear tag ("840" tag) which must be able to be read both visually and electronically. 5. Steers will be placed according to weight into two classes. A third class in any given breed will be established if there are 12 or more steers in any given breed, including crossbreds.
6. No wood shavings will be allowed unless a mat is used underneath.
7. Steers and market heifers must weigh at least 1000 pounds to sell at the auction, and must weigh at least 900 pounds to be exhibited.
8. Cow and Calf class shall have all breeds and crossbred show together. Calf may be either sex.
9. Junior Bull Calf must be no older than January 1, 2026.
10. Breeding Heifer classes shall be based on the following age categories:
 - Jr. Heifer Calf – January 1, 2026 or after
 - Senior Heifer Calf – September 1-December 31, 2025
 - Late Summer Yearling- July 1-Aug 31, 2025
 - Early Summer Yearling Heifer – May 1-June 30, 2025
 - Late Junior Yearling Heifer – March 1-April 30, 2025
 - Early Junior Yearling Heifer – January 1 – February 28, 2025
 - Junior Yearling Heifer – November 1-December 31, 2024
 - Senior Yearling Heifer- September 1-October 31, 2024
11. There will be one market heifer class. Market Heifers entered are eligible to show for Grand Champion Market Animal but may not be shown in the breeding heifer show.
12. **Pre-registration is required.** All **mailed entries** must be **postmarked by Monday, July 20th.** **On-Line entries** close at **Midnight Sunday, July 26, 2026.** Visit our website www.cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links and fair updates.. Sheep Department Rules:

1. All livestock exhibits must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor for a period of at least 90 days prior to the fair.
2. **Entry fees are \$4.00 per class. There are no pen fees.** No refunds will be given.
3. In all breeding classes, each exhibitor will be **limited to one entry per class per breed**. Each exhibitor is entitled to show two (2) market ewe lambs and two (2) market wethers; production animals shall not be counted toward the two. Classes will be determined by weight.
4. Ewe lambs or ram lambs entered in breeding classes must be purebred and registered in the exhibitor's name. **Registration papers will be checked**
5. All lambs must be docked.

7. A breeding pen shall be 3 individuals; both sexes represented. One yearling may be used.
8. A market pair shall be 2 lambs either market ewe or market wether not shown as breeding stock.
9. Each animal may show in its own age class only.
10. Junior and Senior lambs are divided on January 1 birthdates.
11. Champion sheep (offered on the sale) shall remain for the sale.
12. Production sheep should enter classes 560 and 570. Enter ADG and Grooming only once.
13. Shepherd's Award presented to youth's overall performance throughout fair - given by superintendents
14. **Pre-registration is required. All mailed entries must be postmarked by Monday, July 20th. On-Line entries close at Midnight Sunday, July 26, 2026.** Visit our website www.cullomjuniorfair.com or our Facebook page for on-line entry links and fair updates.. Those making on-line entries are asked to mail entry fees or bring to the fair. Entries received after the deadline will be accepted with a late fee of \$10.00 per exhibitor. No additional entries will be allowed on show day.

Sheep Costume Lead (Friday, 5:30 pm)

1. Open to anyone 14 years of age and younger.
2. Animals will be ewe lambs, ram lambs, yearling ewes, or wethers and must be trimmed and fitted for the show.
3. Entrants must wear a costume and lead their sheep on a halter.
4. Entry deadlines are the same as all other departments.
5. Entry fee \$5.50
6. Entry theme should promote the Sheep Industry
7. Costume Lead shall be scored using the following points:
 - Costume - 30 points
 - Originality and Slogan - 20
 - Promotion of Sheep Industry in Costume and Slogan - 20 points
 - How Sheep Handles - 10 points
